

Discoveries in the Amazon

The Amazon rainforest is the biggest **tropical** rainforest in the world. It covers a small part of the planet, but an enormous number of plant and animal species live here, like the jaguar, sloths, and many kinds of frogs.




There are millions of different species in the Amazon, and scientists and photographers have explored the rainforests many times. They find a new species of plant or animal every two or three days.



Have you ever seen a pink dolphin? Scientists have found a species of pink river dolphin. They've also **discovered** monkeys called fire-tailed zoque zagues. These are gray monkeys that have orange beards and tails. They have hidden in the rainforest for years. Explorers have found them because there aren't so many trees now, so the animals are easier to see. People have **cut down** trees so they can use the land for farms and the trees for paper and wood.

Many of these new species of animals are already endangered, and some species will be **extinct** before we can find them. Almost 50,000 different species become extinct every year. Their habitat is endangered because the rainforest is changing quickly.

New species are important for new discoveries in science. A lot of medicines are made with plants from the rainforest, and a lot of the world's food comes from the Amazon, so it's a very important habitat that we have to protect. Now, people around the world are reusing more materials like paper and plastic, and some schools are planting new trees. What can you do to help protect these habitats?
